

Mission Accomplished

Our second Mission trip to Romania took place at the end of October last year. The team comprised of fifteen young people (including one of our volunteers and two of our drop-in visitors headed up by six leaders.

There was a whole mix of bubbles, music, fun, craft, tears, painting, talks, games, food, friendship, sadness and joy as the team shared with children and adults across orphanages, care homes, prisons, homeless folk and community groups. As last year they worked under the ministry of Pater Noster, a small church-based organisation who have built up a network of opportunities that covers a wide spectrum of the local community

Youth leaders Anthony and Selina plus Sam and (our own) Hannah led the teams with a great deal of pastoral care and sensitivity. The week saw some really life-changing moments for a number of the team. These are just a few of the comments from some of the young people who came with us...

....I learnt a lot whilst being in Romania...like to always have faith in people to hold you up when you need them most! I got to spend an incredible week, learning so much about myself and why I was there, about the people around me and about the power that God has over everybody. Laughing with people I never thought would like me...

...it was a truly life-changing experience, in terms of making new friends and working as part of a great team, but also in terms of experiencing first hand just how much God can do for everyone, even those who are in the most dire of circumstances...

We believe that young people have much to offer to others less fortunate than themselves but that they can also learn so much about themselves as they do that offering. This is the reason we undertake Mission Romania.

We have also been visiting an ex-Venue user who is currently serving a prison sentence.
